An eight-hour course to enhance an officer's investigation techniques regarding impaired driving beyond the basic Standardized Field Sobriety Tests course. Proper administration and interpretation of the Standardized Field Sobriety Tests and articulating it in a report to assist prosecutors with successful convictions. An introduction to drugged driving to include observable signs usually associated with the seven drug categories and medical conditions that may mimic drug impairment.



#### **Course Introduction - 10 minutes**

Instructor introduction.

- 1) Explain the course objective.
  - a) Gain an understanding of impaired-driving enforcement programs.
  - b) Become proficient in DUI/DWI detection.
  - c) Gain an understanding of how drug involvement impacts vehicle crashes.
- 2) Encourage attendees to ask questions and share feedback with other attendees.
- 3) Explain that certificates will be emailed after the class and each student will be registered in the Blue to Gold University.
- 4) Go over the three disclaimers:
  - a) Laws and agency standard operating procedures may be more restrictive. Blue to Gold teaching the federal standard unless otherwise stated. Therefore, students must know their state and local requirements in addition to the federal standard.
