The average violent encounter occurs for 3-5 seconds, the law enforcement response time is 5-7 seconds. Creating a very dangerous gap for law enforcement.



Course Introduction - 10 minutes

Instructor introduction.

- 1) Explain the course objective.
 - a) Identify pre-incident indicators of an attack.
 - b) Ability to define normal behavior from abnormal.
 - c) Gain an understanding action versus reaction.
- 2) Encourage attendees to ask questions and share feedback with other attendees.
